Please take time to read carefully the following terms and conditions that you may find useful when planning your visit to our Residence.

Reservation

Should you wish to accept our quotation, please confirm your booking by email at info@bluemarinebibione.it.

The reservation must be guaranteed by a non-refundable deposit of 30% of total amount per room. This can be paid by bank transfer or credit card (Visa, MasterCard). Please note that for stays of 3 nights or less, the full payment is required at the time of booking.

Amendment/cancellation

The reservation will be considered provisional until a deposit has been received. We reserve the right to re let the accommodation if a deposit has not been received within the agreed period. Any change or cancellation request must be made in writing to info@bluemarinebibione.it

Our cancellation policy is the following:

- For cancellation made at least 15 days before the arrival date: the deposit can be used within the next season
- For cancellation made 14 days or less before the arrival date or in case of noshow: the entire amount of the deposit is charged as cancellation fee
- In case of late arrival due to any circumstances, the entire booked period must be paid
- In case of early departure, a fee equivalent to the cost of 3-night stay will be charged.

During your stay

Hotel rooms are available from 3 pm and we kindly ask that all guests depart by no later than 10am. On the day of departure, our guests can use the hotel facilities until 10am (bicycles, pool and parking).

Whilst the residence will attempt to accommodate requests wherever possible, the residence does not guarantee special requests such as specific room numbers, floor allocations or views.

We accept **small dogs and cats** (max 10 kg and max 1 animal per apartment). A supplement of \in 15.00 per night is applied.

Regarding food allergies or intolerances

Should you have any food allergies or intolerances, please give us advice at the time of booking and we will do our outmost to accommodate these. Our restaurant staff can provide assistance on any questions may you have. Furthermore, please note that whilst precautions will be taken during food preparation to prevent cross contamination, however, we cannot guarantee that will be no traces of the allergen in the meals provided as the meals are not prepared in an allergen free environment.
